

## **STANLEY TUCCI**

Stanley Tucci is an Academy Award–nominated actor who has appeared in more than 90 films, countless television shows, and over a dozen stage productions on and off Broadway.

Tucci is acclaimed for his work across all mediums. He was nominated for an Academy Award, Golden Globe Award, BAFTA Award, and SAG Award, and received a Broadcast Film Critics nomination for his performance in *The Lovely Bones*, directed by Peter Jackson. He also won both an Emmy and a Golden Globe for his starring role as fast-talking tabloid columnist Walter Winchell in Paul Mazursky's TV movie *Winchell*, and another Golden Globe for his portrayal of Lt. Colonel Adolf Eichmann in HBO's *Conspiracy*.

In addition to his acting career, Tucci is beloved for his culinary and travel work. He hosted CNN's Emmy Award—winning series *Stanley Tucci: Searching for Italy* and National Geographic's *Tucci: In Italy*, exploring the rich food traditions and cultural heritage of his ancestral homeland.

Tucci's breakout success behind the camera came with *Big Night*, his first film as co-director, co-screenwriter, and actor. The film earned widespread acclaim, including the Waldo Salt Screenwriting Award at the 1996 Sundance Film Festival, recognition from the National Board of Review, an Independent Spirit Award, the Critics' Prize at the Deauville Film Festival, and honors from both the New York and Boston Film Critics Societies.

He continued to build on his filmmaking achievements with *Final Portrait* (2017), which he wrote and directed. The biographical comedy, telling the story of Swiss painter Alberto Giacometti, premiered to critical praise and was nominated for a British Independent Film Award. Tucci also directed and co-starred as *The New Yorker* staff writer Joseph Mitchell in *Joe Gould's Secret*, executive produced *Behind the Sun*, co-wrote and directed *Blind Date* (a remake of Theo Van Gogh's 1996 film), and produced Ivan Kavanagh's horror film *The Canal*.

Tucci's extensive film credits include A Private War, The Silence, Night Hunter, Spotlight, The Hunger Games trilogy, Patient Zero, The Children Act, Beauty and the Beast, Transformers: The Last Knight, A Little Chaos, Transformers: Age of Extinction, Muppets Most Wanted, Percy Jackson: Sea of Monsters, The Company You Keep, Jack the Giant Slayer, Captain America: The First Avenger, Julie & Julia, The Devil Wears Prada, The Terminal, Road to Perdition, and Deconstructing Harry, among many others.

At the 2020 Sundance Film Festival, Tucci appeared in *Worth*, which tells the true story of attorney Ken Feinberg's efforts to help 9/11 victims. Tucci stars as Charles Wolf, opposite Michael Keaton and Amy Ryan. He also voiced the character Bitsy in Apple TV+'s animated musical comedy *Central Park*, and appeared in *The King's Man* and *The Witches* (2020), based on Roald Dahl's classic novel, opposite Anne Hathaway and Octavia Spencer.

Tucci's television work includes roles in *Limetown*, *BoJack Horseman*, *American Masters*, *Feud*, *Fortitude*, *American Dad!*, *Robot Chicken*, *30 Rock*, *Metropolis*, *Bull*, *Wiseguy*, *The Equalizer*, *thirtysomething*, and *The Street*. He also starred as Captain Hook in ITV's *Peter & Wendy*, alongside Laura Fraser and Paloma Faith. He received Emmy nominations for his performances in *Murder One* and *ER*, and won the Emmy Award for Outstanding Guest Actor in a Comedy Series for *Monk*.

On stage, Tucci made his Broadway directorial debut with a revival of Ken Ludwig's *Lend Me a Tenor*, starring Tony Shalhoub. The production earned a Tony Award nomination for Best Revival of a Play. His theater credits include *Frankie and Johnny in the Clair de Lune*, *Execution of Hope*, *The Iceman Cometh*, *Brighton Beach Memoirs*, and *The* 



Misanthrope. Tucci has also performed extensively off-Broadway, including at Yale Repertory Theatre and SUNY Purchase, where he first studied acting.

A passionate cook and storyteller, Tucci is the author of two bestselling cookbooks: The Tucci Cookbook (2012), which appeared on The New York Times Best Sellers list, and The Tucci Table: Cooking with Family and Friends (2014), co-written with his wife, Felicity Blunt. The latter features recipes that blend Tucci's Italian heritage with his wife's British culinary traditions.
